Assignment

Convert lines 328–350 of Krapp's edition of *Genesis B* to TEI-compliant XML. (The relevant page has been made available on [Stud.IP](#).) Upload the XML source to Stud.IP's homework folder, along with a PDF compiled using the transformation tool at <https://langeslag.uni-goettingen.de/editing>. (Use `genesisb_yourfirstname.xml` and `.pdf` as the filenames.) If transformation fails upload the XML only, but include a comment element containing your analysis of the problem.

XML Standard

Your edition should be in TEI-compliant XML based on our template for critical editions. Although for the present assignment there is only one witness, you will nevertheless use a critical apparatus environment not only wherever the edited text (i.e. the lemma) diverges from the actual manuscript reading as recorded in the notes, but also to record any notes in Krapp's apparatus regarding scribal interventions.

Because Old English verse conventionally registers a caesura between two halflines, you would do well to use the TEI element `<caesura/>` for this purpose.

The text survives in [Oxford, Bodleian Library, MS Junius 11, p. 18](#). Since we are working from an edition rather than the images, however, you'll want to cite the edition as your witness, along the lines of
